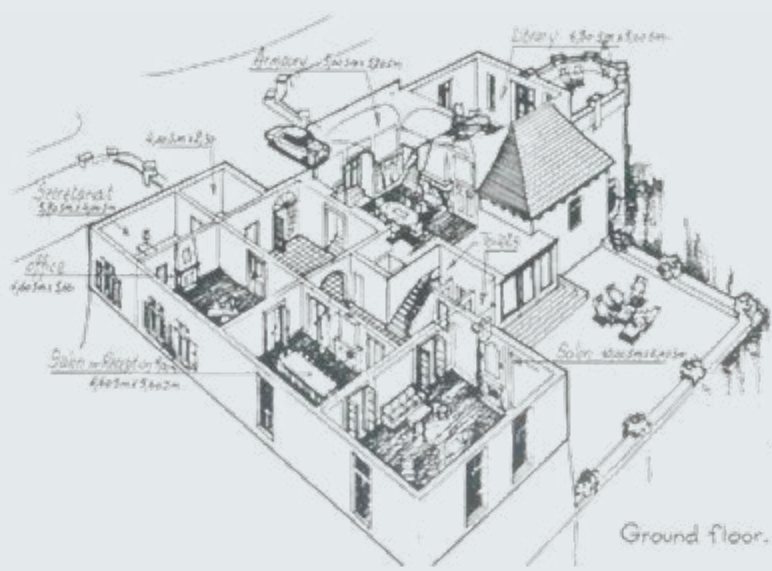

## A LITTLE HISTORY...

Welcome to the Château comtal de Rivieren, a place that bears the marks of history. Since 1983, the castle and its park have been classified as a vestige of medieval origin and feudal style in the Brussels-Capital Region.

The history of this castle dates back to the 12<sup>th</sup> century, when a fortified tower was erected as an integral part of the capital's defensive system. Owned by the Clutinck family, a wealthy family of industrialists, merchants, and landowners, the castle was named after the husband of the heiress, Charles de Rivieren d'Arschot.

In the 17<sup>th</sup> century, the tower was topped with a pear-shaped roof, while a new main building was constructed. The ground floor was decorated as a reception hall, adorned with stucco ceilings. The magnificent moat and drawbridge disappeared over the course of renovations.
